## **Information for Live in Volunteers**

### **LIVING EXPENSES**

World Hunger Relief, Inc. will provide you with living quarters, food, training. You are responsible for covering all other expenses. Such expenses may include, but are not limited to:

- ~Transportation to and from World Hunger Relief, Inc.
- ~Long-distance and international phone calls
- ~Travel or entertainment

### **LIFE AT THE FARM**

World Hunger Relief, Inc. is a working farm. Your time here will be highly interactive with other members of the World Hunger Relief, Inc. community, a wide variety of animals and plants, and the land itself. Interns who live at World Hunger Relief, Inc. share a kitchen, sometimes a bedroom and bathroom, and all farm work and household chores. Everyone works together and cooking and chores are assigned on a rotating basis. Mornings at World Hunger Relief, Inc. begin with a group devotional and work assignment meeting and we share in a community meal during the lunch hour. Public consumption of alcohol is not permitted on the WHRI property.

### **VISAS**

If we apply for your visa, it will be a training visa that allows you to come to the United States for one year. This visa does not allow you to work and earn money while you are in the United States. In order to obtain your visa, it is important that you complete the application in detail. For example, when asked for your current employment, please do not answer only “self-employed.” Please tell us about your work and business.

**World Hunger Relief, Inc.** provides training and education in small-scale, sustainable agriculture. Although we do use a tractor for some tasks, we do not make large farm machinery a central feature of our agricultural work. Our farm is operated organically, thus we do not use synthetic fertilizers, pesticides, or herbicides. Because we are a working, commercial farm, interns are expected to take an active role in both management and labor. A significant portion of your learning experiences will take place through hands-on, physical labor on the farm. In addition, we will schedule classes and assign weekly readings but we also expect you to take significant initiative in pursuing learning beyond our basic curriculum. Finally, you will be living in community with other Christians, and as such you will need to be committed to effective communication and participation in social and spiritual activities that mold us into a cohesive community.
